With expertise in **Enterprise Design Thinking, Agile methodologies**, and a vast knowledge of **Information Technology**—spanning InfoSec to Blockchain—Jamal brings a holistic approach to solving societal challenges. By combining these professional capabilities with lived experience, we aim to redefine community partnership standards and create impactful, sustainable change.

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Implementation Timeline

Phase 2: Q2 (Launch and Pilot)

- Implement pilot programs with mental health, childcare, and workforce development partners.
- Secure funding commitments from at least two philanthropic organizations.
- Begin developing tokenized housing systems with real estate partners.

Phase 3: Q3 (Scaling)

- Expand partnerships to include additional local businesses and educational institutions.
- Launch full-scale housing apprenticeship programs with wraparound services.
- Host quarterly coalition meetings to align on progress and outcomes.

Phase 4: Q4 (Evaluation and Growth)

- Evaluate partnership impact and participant outcomes.
 - Publish a partnership impact report highlighting successes and areas for improvement.
 - Develop a roadmap for Year 2, focusing on scaling successful initiatives.
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Key Metrics for Success

- **Participant Outcomes:**
 - 85% program completion rate.
 - 70% job placement within six months of completion.
 - **Partnership Engagement:**
 - 10 active partnerships established by Year 1.
 - \$2 million in secured funding or in-kind contributions.
